In 2024, Village Hope International advanced its mission to empower vulnerable children and families through holistic education and healthcare programs across Uganda and the United States. As a California-based 501(c)(3) nonprofit, the organization delivered measurable impact through child sponsorships, caregiver training, clean water initiatives, and mobile health outreach, reaching hundreds of lives with dignity-driven support. With 200 caregivers and health workers trained in Uganda alone, Village Hope demonstrated its commitment to equity, inclusion, and operational excellence. Strategic partnerships, rigorous monitoring, and community-centered programs ensured that every initiative not only met urgent needs but also fostered long-term resilience. This report reflects a year of compassion in action, where hope was not just promised but delivered.

Mission: To Support Vulnerable Children to Acquire Formal Education and Modern Healthcare Services - Ensuring that every child, regardless of their background, lives a healthy life and has an opportunity to learn, grow, and thrive.

03. 2024 Program Highlights & Impact Metrics

I. Healthcare Training Program — Uganda

Empowering caregivers and community leaders with knowledge in disease prevention, hygiene, and nutrition. In 2024, our Healthcare Training Program advanced community well-being in Butaleja District, Eastern Uganda through two stakeholder awareness meetings that engaged 200 participants, including caregivers, health workers, and community members. These sessions focused on critical health topics such as personal hygiene promotion, maintaining a safe home environment, home-based management of common childhood illnesses, and HIV/AIDS sensitization, prevention, and care—strengthening local capacity for healthier, more informed communities.



> Impact: 200 individuals trained.

> Location: Butaleja District.

> Focus Areas: Malaria, HIV/AIDS, sanitation, childhood illness management.

> Outcome: Improved community health literacy and reduced disease transmission

II. Child Sponsorship Program — Uganda

Transforming lives through comprehensive support: medical care, education, nutrition, and hygiene.

Service Provided	2024 Impact

- ➤ **Outcome:** Increased school attendance, reduced stigma, and improved health outcomes.
- ➤ **Narrative:** Each child sponsored is not just supported, they are empowered to rise above poverty and become agents of change in their communities.

III. Clean Drinking Water Program — Uganda

Delivering safe, sustainable water sources to protect families from waterborne diseases.



- > **Impact:** 2 water sources developed (1 well, 1 rainwater harvesting system).
- **Reach:** Hundreds of children and families.
- > **Outcome:** Reduced child mortality, improved hygiene, and enhanced daily life.

IV. Caregivers Support Program — Uganda.

Equipping caregivers with tools to nurture children emotionally, physically, and educationally.



- > **Impact:** 300 caregivers trained.
- > **Services:** First aid, emotional support, access to food, healthcare, and education.
- **Outcome:** Stable, nurturing environments for vulnerable children.

V. Life-Saving Medicines for Children — Uganda

Providing essential treatments and vaccines to combat preventable childhood illnesses.

- > **Impact:** 1,000 children served.
- > **Medicines Delivered:** Antimalarials, deworming tablets, polio and TB vaccines.
- ➤ **Outcome:** Reduced childhood mortality and strengthened community health.



VI. Bridging Healthcare Access — California & Uganda

Connecting underserved families to essential medical services.



- ➤ **Impact:** 120 individuals linked to hospitals and healthcare services.
- > **Services:** Insurance application assistance, referrals, transportation.
- ➤ **Outcome:** Reduced barriers to care for children, seniors, and disabled individuals.
